This two-week course prepares students for the late-summer and fall ACTs. Students learn test-taking strategies, experience practice exams, and review test material. This course is offered in partnership with Summit Prep.

ALGEBRA 1 (FOR CREDIT)

Successful completion of this six-week course offers a full year of credit for Algebra 1. Students explore all aspects of Algebra 1 and acquire the strong background needed for future math courses.

ALGEBRA 1 REVIEW

This one-week review course strengthens skills and covers content from Algebra I to ensure a smooth transition to Geometry during the full academic year.

ALGEBRA II / TRIGONOMETRY (FOR CREDIT)

Successful completion of this six-week course offers a full year of credit for Algebra II/Trig. Students explore all aspects of Algebra II and Trigonometry. Topics satisfy all IB requirements.
